"Shalu is a very intelligent girl and she is good with all the activity in my RISE center but before joining rise center Shalu was very depressed from her father's domestic violence. Her mother is the only source of earning in her home. Her father always drinks and fights with her mother for money and sometime shalu become the victim of beating. Now shalu comes in RISE center and spend a good time with us and increases her concentration in other activities. As a result of her affection, she got a best scholastic performer". says Neelam, her educator.

Shalu basically belongs from dhak market of Gorakhpur area. Her father has three brothers and all live separately. Shalu's grandparent's lives in the village. There is a lot of poverty in her village. Farming was the only source of living for her grandparents and his father but through farming, they were not able to fulfil basic need

and amenities so her father moved to Delhi. Shalu's father is not working and Shaul's mother works as a servant in other homes. Shalu and her family live in one room which has a kitchen. Shalu has 2 brothers and 2 sisters and they find it quite difficult to survive in such a small space.

Shalu's father Dinesh is a simple man who all sort of work likes repairing of cyling fans and motors and sometimes sits ideally at home with no work. Shalu mother Kiran remains much tensed since it's very difficult to survive and fulfill basic needs in such case. Shalu's mother has all the responsibility of home and she is unable to give private tuition to them to develop the learning ability. Shalu mother found RISE Centre and got them admitted in RISE center. After joining the RISE centre Shalu increased the learning ability and she also got involved in extra curriculum activities like dance, Singing, art& craft. Shalu got best scholastic performance prize at annual day function and present beautiful a folk dance.
