PAB in Kalandar Colony - the hub of Nomads

Kalandar Colony, the slum in the North East Delhi zone houses the Nomads called Kalandars - or Bhalu walas. Till a few years back, they used to visit colonies and entertained children and adults performing animal shows with monkeys, bears, mongoose, snakes, etc. When a ban was imposed on use of animals for such shows, their livelihood was eroded and poor nomads had to look for other options of income. Still remain unsettled and their children out-of-school. Padho aur Badho has opened six centres in this slum and the Nomads are now excited about their future prospects.

Kalandar Colony, like all other slums, characterized by over crowding, unsystematically developed and generally neglected with deterioration in sanitary conditions, civic amenities or absence of facilities.

The total population of the Kalandar colony is between 6500-7000 with approximately 2300 falling in the age bracket of 0-6 years and 1200 in the group of 6-14 years with10 Anganwadis. The stretch has no drainage system and the MCD has fixed Mobile toilets. Only one dispensary is currently run by Delhi govt.

AROH Foundation had stepped in the area to examine the state of primary education and realized the hard fact that all the kids of the community, literally loitering around the streets through out the day with having no access to food, shelter and clothing.

Erosion of Livelihood for Kalandars – the Nomads

Kalandar colony is situated in the adjoining areas of Dilshad garden metro station and Deepak colony. The people who live here basically were nomads who wander from place to place. They exhibit some road shows using animals like bear and monkey to earn a living. Since it is termed as a cruelty to animals by organizations like PETA, all animals under their belt were taken away by the government and left the bread winners In lurch.



For their day to day living they were forced to work as laborers, maidservants and cleaners etc. Mr Mizaz Khan belonging to one of the oldest familv who migrated from Bulandshahr in search of prosperity told us that during the earlier days they used to make about Rs 300 per day using animals but after the ban they are left out in open with no roof over there head and food. The helpless situation has led them to thinking of educating their kids. Even the younger generation wants to pursue education so that they could land up in a stable state of livelihood when they grow up.

Another section of the community, which hails from Moradabad used to

prepare Hand made Dholaks and Drums and would sell it in the market for a nice some of money which can buy them both food and shelter. Nowa-days no one prefers to use the instruments which have led to the dying of this art and they are forced to work as daily wage laborers. Since the amount earned can only take care of their basic needs educating their kids turned to be next to impossible. Those who have migrated from Bihar work as Cobblers outside metro station and railway station. One mohalla in the community is occupied by Magicians who perform acts in circus and on streets to earn a living. All those who reside dwell in utter poverty without basic amenities and their kids remain illiterate.

AROH team encountered with a boy named Rohit aged 12 years while exploring the by lanes of the area. He was on his way to work and enquired him on the reason behind working as a boot polisher. He told that his father ran way and being the eldest he has to take care of the family and now even if he wants to study he cannot as he has crossed a certain age. He also informed about the nature of dirty things happening in the area like drugs, smuggling and prostitution and asked whether any changes can be brought in.

All the facts made us realize to open PAB centres in the area. When AROH's mobilization team visited the area for passing out information about its Padho aur Badho Project in the community, Mr Tahir a resident of the kalandar colony expressed his frustration as "Beta hum toh pade likhe nahi hain lekin abb ki nasal ko padana chahte hai, anparh aadmi toh sirf janwar ke samaan hai, sadak par hadsa ho jae to gaadi ka number bhi nahi note kar sakte". This realization has led him to enroll his two daughters at our PAB centre.

Another girl named Gulabshah told the visiting mobilizers as "Sir Mujhe bade hokar doctor banana hai". Now we are glad to say that she has been enrolled as a PAB beneficiary. The artisans of the dying art were glad to see their wards going to school at no extra cost.

AROH's Outreach within the community

After assessing the prelim survey done by our mobilizers, AROH Foundation has opened up 6 NFE centres in the area for catering to the kids of said slum. Educators like Mamta, Sumitra, Sangita, Soni, Priyanka, Suman have developed a good network within the community as they belong to the same locality and has brought the kids under the PAB fold. Almost 200 kids have been enrolled in the current session. To strengthen our reach and the program all national and regional festivals were being organized with the community members within the community.

Even though the government has taken steps to open more schools the need of awareness among studentparents, advocacy and counseling is the need of the hour and AROH is trying its best to educate the kids leading to mainstreaming in the government schools.

Padho aur Badho encourages interns



Ms. Maitrani Dutta a Post Graduate student of Rural Planning, CEPT University, Ahmedabad's internship project was on Benefits of non formal education and sought AROH's help to do a case study. Her request got sanctioned and she was asked to carry out her project at our South Delhi PAB cluster.

Ms Dutta accompanied by Ms Vijite Senior Officer-CSR at GAIL India Ltd reached the centre by 12.30 PM on 6 January, 2012. They were given a tour on PAB as well GAIL-GARIMA centre by the program Manager Ms Jyoti . They interacted with the beneficiaries of both the projects along with supervisors and educators of PAB and learnt about the problems they faced during mobilization and how they tackled with confidence.

She also took note of the teaching methodologies adopted for various course to make it more interesting than mere academia so that the beneficiaries does not lack concentration during their studies. Beneficiaries too showed their learning capabilities by rhyming out some poems and tables taught by their educators. Feedback in form of some suggestions and ideas were exchanged and AROH team members welcomed the move.



Capacity Building Workshop for PAB Team

hhancing PAB Educators' Creative Talent through Capacity Building Workshop

While the PAB kids enjoyed a short 'Winter Break' from 2 -7 January, the educators were engaged in the capacity building workshops which were designed to hone their skills and teaching abilities. Week-long workshops were held at all four nodal centres where educators got a chance to interact, not only with the senior management staff, but also with subject experts and practitioners. All the educators attended the workshop on 'Enriching Talent'.

For the Ghaziabad cluster, key resource persons', Mrs. Kiran and Ms. Richa were invited from Katha, an NGO working in the field of education. The experience sharing was a useful exercise and the educators learnt from the experience of the resource persons. All the educators of PAB-Ghaziabad cluster, along with supervisors, mobilisers and coordinators assembled for the workshop at their nodal centre. A small ice breaking session was initiated by the coordinator which put the participants at ease. After the introduction round, the trainers questioned the educators on their journey with life and AROH's program. They were charmed by their enthusiastic replies.

At this juncture Mrs Kiran posed questions to the educators on creative knowledge. Only fifty percent of the present educators were able to show their talents in front of them. Mrs Kiran explained the exact meaning of 'craft' and how one could enhance their talent by imbibing the simple techniques using old waste materials like papers, match boxes, sticks, cotton, candy papers, used clothes and even left over vegetables and pulses.

Hands-on training boosted the participants and they made flowers and flower pots from waste boxes, puppets from sticks and small logs, soft toys using cotton balls, and toys





from used bottles. All the educators enjoyed the session thoroughly and even got their queries answered. They also ensured that they would teach their students and would enrich the tender ones craft skills.

North East Delhi Cluster

At the NED cluster a 3 day workshop was conducted on 2, 4 & 5 January, 2012 at their nodal office in Jawahar Park. The workshop was headed by Mr. Ashish Kumar, Mr.Deepak Singh and Ms. Aarti Thapa respectively. The main thrust of the workshop was to impart skilled teaching techniques using various methodology, maintaining the decorum of the PAB center, neat and cleanliness of the area around the centre etc. An insight of the sponsors views and expectations and how to conduct oneself during the sponsors visit was also briefed.

Apart from that a short presentation about 'Right to Education' was also screened to help the educators in smooth mobilizing. A recalling session on vision and mission of 'Padho aur Badho' was conducted to keep them focused in their goals. Educators were also briefed on the approaching techniques of



government officials and the hierarchy of the order for mainstreaming the beneficiaries.

Ms Aarti Thapa explained them about the ways of filling PAB registration forms, preparing case studies, fun ways of teaching and learning etc. The workshop benefitted all the 42 PAB educators and 17 VT instructors. Even the supervisors pitched in and helped them to analyze the worth of education through street plays.

The workshop concluded with a vote of thanks by the Coordinator and wishing them a beautiful enchanting year ahead.

Noida & East Delhi and South Delhi Cluster

Similarly a Capacity building workshop was organized for the said clusters on 6th & 7th January 2012 respectively by Project Coordinator Mr. Deepak Singh. All the Educators, Supervisors and Cluster Coordinator of both the cluster participated in the same. Padho aur Badho's initiative, Vision, Mission and Goal, Principles and Strategy, Educator's roles & responsibilities, Centers and its infrastructure, Time Schedule, Curriculum, Teaching Methods and Teaching techniques, Teaching Aids, Activities at NFE Center, Events, Case Studies, Success Stories, Area Profile, Tracking mainstreamed beneficiaries and Orientation on Right to Education, how to approach school, whom to contact at which level, filling PAB registration forms and other formats, how to make studies student friendly and on how to maintain decorum of classes were highlighted again to those present.

PAB welcomes the only Male Educator - Amit Kumar



Mostly all the educators of PAB centres are girls and women but only one stands apart in the group. He is Amit Kumar who adorns the role of an educator at G-443, Tigri camp PAB centre. He teaches the beneficiaries during the day and attends his graduation classes in the second half as he is currently enrolled for his B.Com course under DU.

His father a laborer wished all his children to be educated but the meager income earned by him

could only support up to a certain extent. Realizing the dilemma Amit on his own discontinued his studies after intermediate so that his younger siblings can complete their turn of education.

Seeing the same incapability of other kids fathers in his community he thought of helping them out by taking classes for the younger ones but bringing all under one roof seemed next to impossible. At this point he heard about requirement of educator at AROH's PAB centre, he applied himself and got selected.

Each and every day he feels satisfied coz he could teach the kids and nurture their future. Being the only male among the entire group didn't deter him and is rather happy to being associated with the Foundation.

SNEHA's family had migrated to Delhi a few years back, in search of work. With the passage of time, the family grew to seven members, with only two of them earning. But then one more tragedy was waiting to befall upon them—Sneha's father passed away. Her mother could not afford to grieve her husband's loss as she had hungry children to feed. Her elder daughter joined her in earning the bread and started working as maid. Somehow, they survived hunger but school and study remained elusive to them. It was a herculean task to get necessary documents ready for admission, and she neither had time nor the money to get her work done.

When AROH Mobiliser met them with an offer to educate them free of cost, under Padho Aur Badho programme, the family grabbed the opportunity. Her mother started sending all the five girls to school. Although it meant loss of money but mother said, "if they manage to get education, they will not have to



slog like this. We can go hungry sometimes and we are not going to die, but if they miss this opportunity, their chances of a decent life will surely die".

Their sacrifices and hard work have started to pay results. We have got three girls admitted in government school and two this year. This family has been through a real transformation in just a few months. Earlier, there were five illiterate girls with practically no future, but now there are five literate girls who plan to do big in life. We wish them good luck in their future endeavors.
