Anti - Tobacco Day



“Health is like money. You never know the value of it until you lost it.” by Josh Billings is an accurate saying as it informs us to take care of our health as it the only boon we have received from God and we do not appreciate it. Chewing tobacco is spoiling lives of people in such a way that the statistics of death are rising. Thus to combat from tobacco every year, on 31st May, WHO marks World No Tobacco Day (WNTD), highlighting the health and other risks associated with tobacco use, and advocating for effective policies to reduce tobacco consumption. Tobacco is the biggest enemy of public health today and it alone is responsible for killing 2.5 million people annually in our country. Tobacco consumption is a serious health issue, which is neither new nor unknown and the requirement for it to be addressed on an urgent basis need not be stated. Tobacco use is the single most important cause of globally preventable deaths; it kills one in 10 adults worldwide. Smoking is also one of the main causes of death, it kills more than 7 million people around the world each year, and that number is predicted to grow unless anti-tobacco actions are increased. It has been scientifically proven that smoking causes cancer and a host of other diseases like

bronchitis, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, types of cancers, erectile dysfunction in men, but somehow even this formidable list does not act as a deterrent for addicted smokers to quit smoking. India is the second largest consumer of tobacco globally with approximately one-sixth of the world’s tobacco-related deaths. The tobacco problem in India is peculiar due to consumption of variety of smokeless and smoking forms of tobacco along with wide socio-cultural diversity thus reducing tobacco use plays a key role in global efforts to achieve the development goal of reducing premature deaths from non-communicable diseases by one-third by 2030. Smoking tobacco triples your risk of a heart attack.

The focus of World No Tobacco Day 2022 is on *“quitting smoking doesn’t have to be stressful”*. To highlight the health risks associated with tobacco use, RISE children designed a lot of posters, banners and three dimensional models & carried with themselves in the Tobacco free rally to capture the attention of onlookers and by passers.

The children of RISE took a pledge to encourage public and promote them to stop smoking. Children made community people aware on the negative impact that tobacco has on people’s lung health, from cancer to chronic respiratory diseases. Children also made the people who use tobacco in the form of cigarettes; cigars, bidis, chew tobacco, snuff, gutkha etc. understand the fundamental role lungs play for the health and well-being of all people. Children educated community people that whether eating tobacco or other such products will give pleasure for some time but it will take their lives away. It may happen that after chewing tobacco a person feels energetic for a while but have they ever thought why it is so? They make an addiction and will be caught in this wheel which will be hard to get out. The day celebration aimed to draw public attention to spread the message of harmful effects of tobacco use as well as its complications to others. Children argued that tobacco releases stress and stated that it proves to be fatal in the long run. At the end the educators summarized the people about tobacco, its addicting nature, how it leads to fatal and causes incurable diseases and asked the people to take an oath not to follow the practice of consumption of tobacco anymore. Educators ended the day by informing people that *‘life is much more than chewing or smoking tobacco. It is in doing things that make unforgettable memories. Save it!’*



Training of Teachers

A one day workshop was conducted by RISE team to integrate technology into the classroom and how to make it cross curricular. RISE team and educators had a discussion on BLM which would help for future planning also. Selection of activities had been discussed, aim of education was discussed, day to day needs of the children and teachers were assumed in the training as well. The main objective of the workshop was capacity building of educators which mentioned the necessity of intermediate check of the course content for students' benefit; to ensure the objectives that have been declared at the time of beginning of classes; planning, formation of course content and evaluation; remedial education of poor students. In training, RISE team focused on teacher responsibility and accountability, teaching strategies, regular assessments and evaluation, child psychology, making of the child-centered learning materials, etc.

The day was dedicated to talk about different skills, general awareness. Further academic plans and activities were also discussed. The educators were advised to devote time to search contents which help students to be more productive. *"The current workshop was extremely inspiring, refreshing & informative in comparison of the earlier workshop.
